Message from the Director



The board's 2024 budget enabled the Highway Department to achieve a significant milestone: completing over 14 miles of reconditioned roadways for the traveling public. This marks the highest mileage completed in a single year in the 2000s. Our dedicated Highway Department staff successfully completed all six internal roadway reconditioning projects, thanks to efficient use of personnel and equipment, strong leadership, and cooperative weather conditions.

Looking ahead, 2024 promises to be another ambitious and productive year. Our maintenance schedule includes plans to chip seal 20 to 25 miles of roadway. Chip sealing is a critical component of our long-term maintenance strategy, as it protects the wearing surface, prevents water infiltration, and extends the lifespan of our roadways. Additionally, we will reconfigure the XX/OT intersection from a Y to a T design to enhance safety for the traveling public. County crews will also pave and shoulder CTH XX between Midway and STH 35, a stretch last updated in the 1980s. With favorable weather and the continued dedication of our team, we anticipate a highly successful year ahead.

Thank you for your continued support as we work to maintain and improve La Crosse County's infrastructure.

SPOTLIGHT: SEAVER UPDIKE

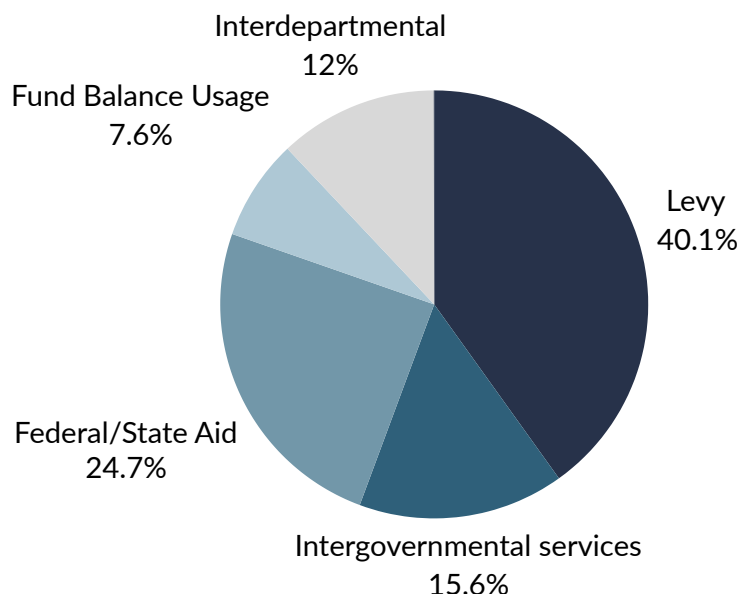
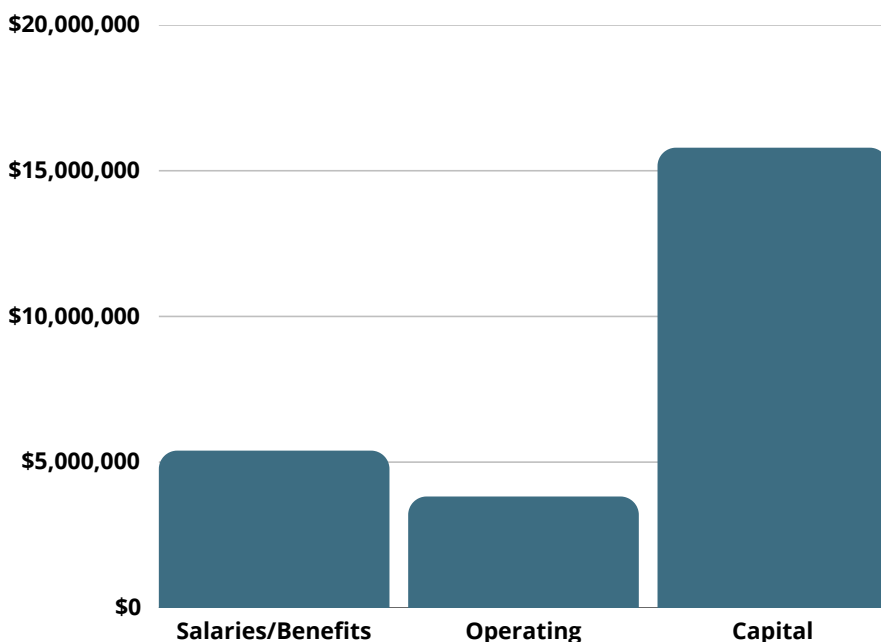
